10 People, 10 Events

1. Enzo Ferrari, first Ferrari built, 1947 and the invention of the Steam Engine, 1712
 - a. Enzo Ferrari built the first Ferrari car in 1947. Although it was not the first car invented, the Ferrari has become one of the most coveted car, and a very wealthy company. The invention of the Steam Engine changed the way of transportation. Steam power was harvested and eventually power boats and trains, changing the way of travel in their time period.
2. John and Charles Deere, first tractor built, 1918 and the invention of the Seed Drill, 1701
 - a. The Deere brothers built their first tractor in 1918, and led to a business of selling tractors and other farming tools. Jethro Tull invented the Seed Drill in 1701, which made an easier and more organized way to plant seeds. When the tractor was invented, the tractor pulled seed drills, rather than having a domesticated animal do the work.
3. Romanticism and Minimalism
 - a. Romantic art embodied and emphasized emotion, aesthetics, and nature. Many emotions that shone through the art were horror, fear, beauty, and love. Through many of the art pieces from this period. Minimalist art often focuses on simplicity and aesthetics, rather than embodying emotions.
4. The Witch Trials and the Ku Klux Klan
 - a. In Europe during the 14th through the 18th centuries, many witch hunts occurred. Women that were in their 20s and not married were often deemed witches. Town healers during the Black Death were also many of the presumed witches during that time. When deemed a witch, the presumed witch would be burned at a stake, or thrown in a jail with other 'witches' until their death. The Ku Klux Klan is a hate group in the United States, and a firm believer in Anglo-Saxon supremacy, or White Supremacy. Members of the KKK killed many activists during the Civil Rights Movement in the 1950s to the late 1960s. Members of the KKK also set crosses on fire in many lawns of African American Families, and also burned churches of African American people in the South. Although the KKK and the Witch Trials are drastically different, they both embody a hate movement, and skepticism. People during the Witch Trials were paranoid of witches, while the KKK hated on non whites and non Christians.

5. Martin Luther and Martin Luther King Jr.
 - a. Martin Luther brought up his concerns to the Catholic Church, through his 95 theses. Through his efforts, he created the Protestant religion, which still used the Bible, but had some different views than the Catholic Church, and was also not corrupt like the Catholic Church was. Luther sparked many other sects of Christianity to arise, Calvinism being one of them. Martin Luther King Jr. was a leader throughout the Civil Rights Movement in the United States. He peacefully led many people through the rough battle, and helped fight for racial equality in the United States. King's efforts resulted in instilling hope in people, mostly the general public of the African American race.
6. Peasants Revolts and the Civil Rights Movement
 - a. The Peasants Revolts were the peasants revolting against the government, due to the high taxes pushed onto them, and the lack of their political influence. Much like the Peasants Revolts, the Civil Rights movement in the United States in the 1950s to the late 1960s were peaceful protests for racial equality, and granting African Americans the privilege to vote.
7. The non acceptance of Calvinism (the Peace of Augsburg) and the lack of acceptance for the LGBTQ+ community
 - a. When the Peace of Augsburg was written, it granted both Protestants and Roman Catholics to freely practice their faith, but French Huguenots, Calvinists, were excluded. The Peace of Augsburg was dismantled and replaced with the Edict of Nantes, which granted Calvinists to practice their religion freely. The LGBTQ+ community in the United States has grown drastically since the beginning the history of our country. Many LGBTQ+ celebrities have come out in the past couple years, due to the raised awareness and acceptance of LGBTQ+ people. Social media has also added support to those first coming out, and many movements have arose, like #loveislove campaign and the #gaybreaktheinternet trend. Gay marriage became legal in 2015, which was long overdue. The gay community has made themselves more aware, and more acceptance from the general public has taken place as well, spreading comfort to young LGBTQ+ individuals.
8. The Age of Exploration and the Conquest of 1760
 - a. During the Age of Exploration, countries like Spain and Portugal discovered, and conquered the New World, which is the modern day United States. The Spanish conquered the lands and made plantations, which had the people native to the lands work the plantations. The Spanish brought disease upon the natives, which killed most of them. Due to the lack of laborers, Spain started enslaving Africans and brought them to the New World to work. The Africans were immune to the diseases that killed the natives, so the slave trade kept booming. During the

Conquest of 1760, the British conquered New France, which is modern day Canada, during the French and Indian War.

9. St. Bartholomew's Day Massacre (mass killing of French Huguenots) and the current thought of all Muslims being terrorists

- a. The St. Bartholomew's Day Massacre was the mass killing of French Huguenots ordered by Catherine de' Medici. Much like how Calvinists were discriminated and killed in 1572, Muslims in our modern day culture are often discriminated and thought of as less in the United States. Many have the idea that all Muslims are terrorists, due to the previous events that have happened in the world. Muslims are often excluded and discriminated against for practicing their faith, wearing the garments that are called for in their religion, and speaking Arabic freely, which is something we should not do.

10. The Sun King and Kim Jong Un

- a. Both Kim Jong Un and Louis XIV of France both ruled through Communist rein. King Louis XIV was not considered a communist ruler, but more of an absolute monarch.
